STATISTICAL BRIEF (JULY - SEPTEMBER 2022)



INTRODUCTION

The performance of the dairy sub sector improved during the quarter due to the rainy season in most parts of the country.

Seasonal Change!

The last month of the quarter i.e. September marked the beginning of a wet season that led to a significant fall in farm gate milk prices as compared to the previous month of August.

MILK PRICES

National Raw Milk prices



Figure 1: Regional Farm gate raw milk prices

Farm gate prices were highest in August and dropped significantly in September especially in the Southwestern region where the price dropped by shs 694! This was due to the increase in milk volumes during the wet season. Northeastern milk shed continues to have the highest farm gate prices overall

Figure 2: Regional Retail prices

The regional highest average retail price was recorded in the Central region in the month of August at shs 2450/liter, and the lowest retail price was recorded in Southwestern milk shed in the month of July at 1400shs per liter.

National average raw milk prices fluctuated throughout the quarter for both farm gate and retail. This was attributed to the change in weather conditions i.e. from dry to wet season. The prices were lowest in September and highest in August.

Figure 4: Comparison of National Average Farm gate raw milk prices at international level in Q1



The average international farm gate prices kept fluctuating during the quarter (July-September) for most counties such as Kenya, Brazil, and United States and so on except Italy whose prices were increasing.

Uganda's FGP was comparable to that of Kenya but far less in comparison to Asia, Europe and North America. This can be attributed to the differences in costs of production.

DAIRY EXPORTS

Figure 5: Dairy exports performance during the quarter

The total value of dairy exports for the guarter was Ugx 45,300,905,160. There was a 70% decrease in exports during the guarter (Q1) compared to the last quarter (Q4 Ugx 150, 353,748,177)

The major 6 dairy exports during the quarter were Liquid milk, Casein, Butter, milk powder, Ghee and Yoghurt. Casein was the most exported dairy product with a value of Ugx 11,863,725,543 accounting for 26% of the total value of dairy exports during the guarter. All the casein was exported to the United States.

The country exported dairy products to the 14 destination countries mainly in Africa, Asia and North America

The US was the biggest export destination accounting for 26 % of the total dairy exports for the destinations during the quarter followed by Kenya and South Sudan.

Figure 6: Dairy Imports



The total value of imports during the quarter was Ugx 4,861,661,418.

Uganda imported several dairy products from a total of 26 countries with Kenya being our leading importing country accounting for 49% of the imports followed by France. The imported dairy products during the quarter were Infant formula, Casein, Ghee Butter, Cheese, Milk powder, Liquid milk, Ice cream and Yoghurt with a total import value of Ugx. 4,861,661,418.



Ice cream was the most imported product accounting for 46% of the total dairy imports during the quarter followed by Infant formula and Cheese
